

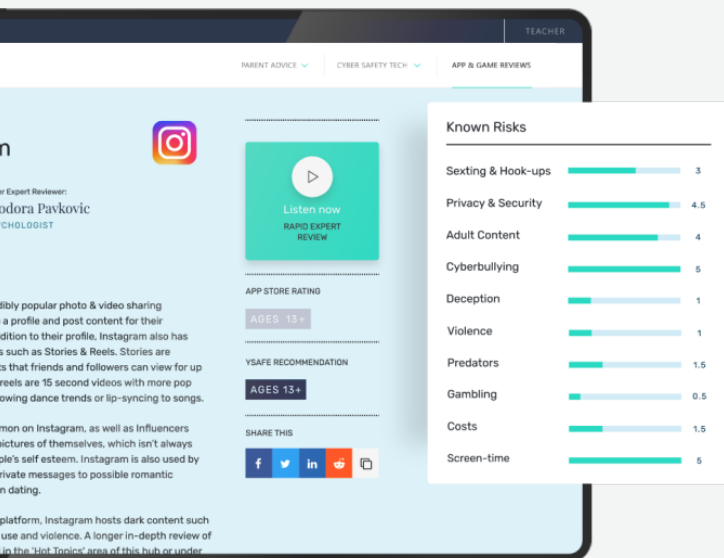
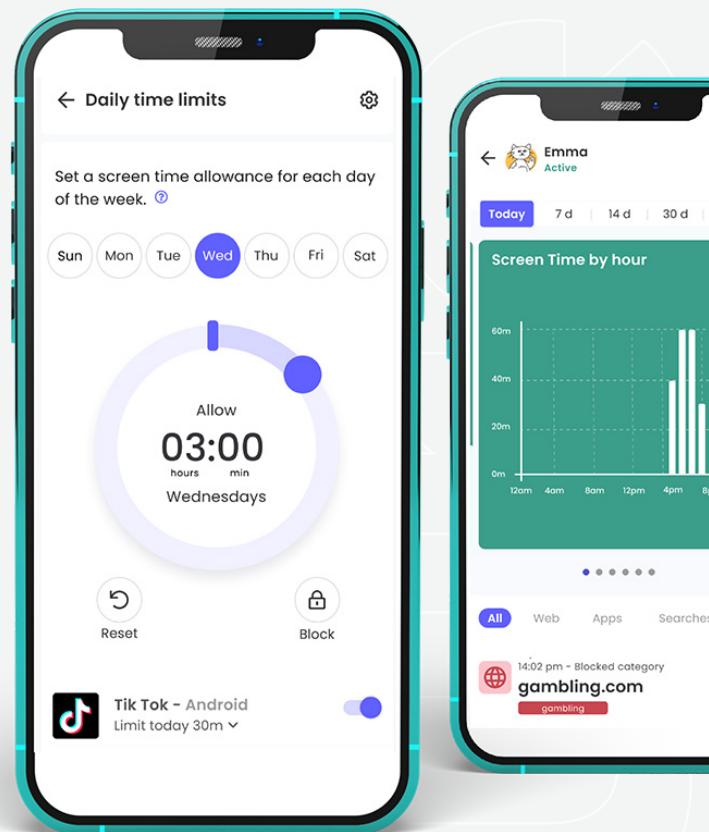

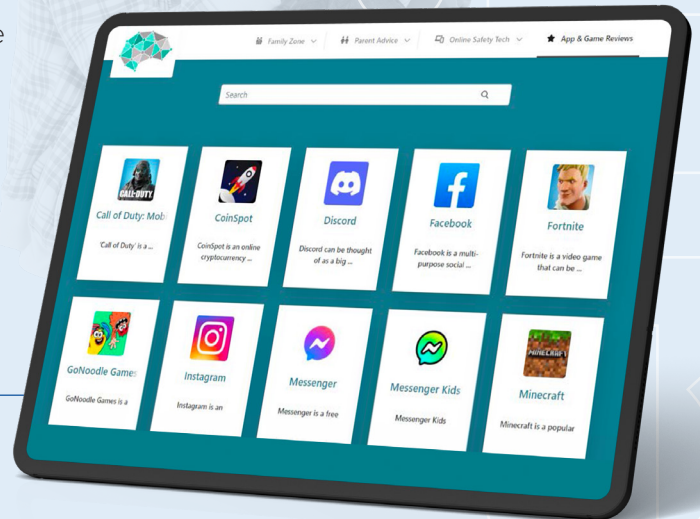

Getting the most from your Online Safety Hub.

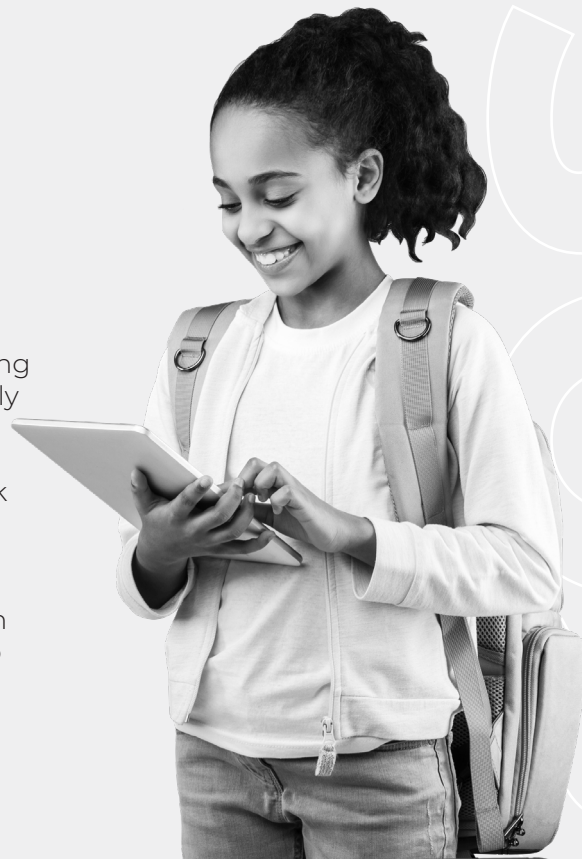
In order to get the most value from your Hub, we recommend that you announce its launch to your school community and promote the resources and parental tools included at different times in the school year.

Tips for ensuring success:

- + Identify an Online Safety Hub champion for your school. It helps to have a dedicated staff member who will be key in supporting this effort.
- + Launch the Hub to your staff for them to make use of the content and use it to cultivate culture of cyber safety.
- + Launch the Hub to your parent community ideally with a launch event or via email (using the announcement templates provided) to ensure they're aware of the resources and tools provided to help their children to stay safe online.
- + Pick a back-to-school period to launch.

Your Hub is more likely to be a success if you:

- + Direct parents to relevant content within the Hub on topics relating to online safety issues that students have been experiencing and make the educational resources readily available.
- + Feature your Online Safety School Hub link across your social media channels, your website and app (if applicable)
- + Use our templates to announce the Hub in your newsletters and social media posts to families.



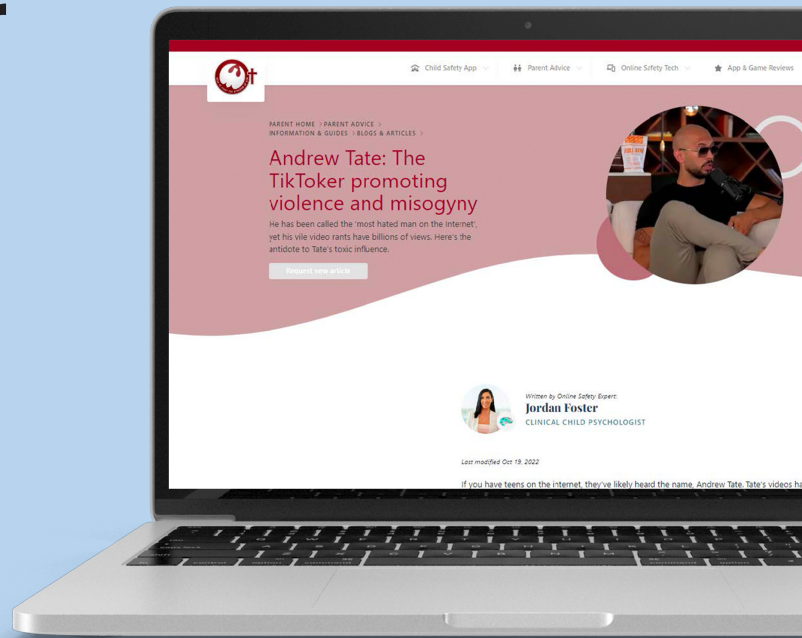

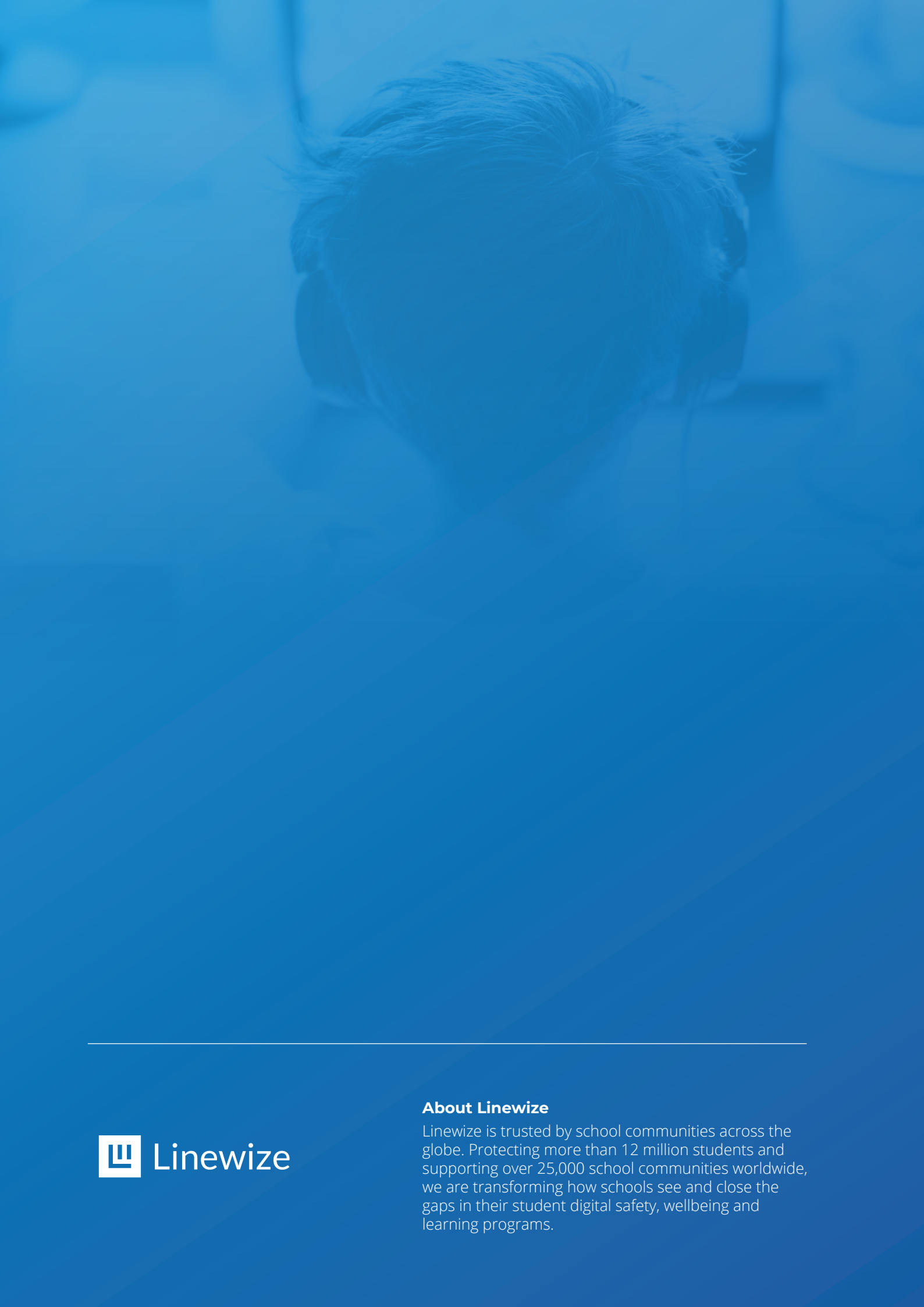
